# Progress Update



During this period we have poured the concrete ground beams and some of the ground floor slab and associated drainage.

Within the next period we plan to complete the ground floor slab completely and commence the main building frame and panelling system.

We have also successfully completed a Considerate Contractors Scheme audit. Although a great score was achieved, we welcome feedback from our neighbours to continually improve

We have now moved into our new offices and have put in place a dedicated pedestrian access with security turn-style on the North West corner of the site.

Piled foundations are complete and the remainder of the substructure is well under way.



In the next phase a tower crane will be used to erect the steel frame of the school and will be in position for approximately 2 months. Please feel free to contact the site team to discuss any concerns.

With the increase in activities on site resources will also increase but we do not anticipate this creating an adverse effect on the surrounding area.



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
