Dear Parents and Carers,

The term is well underway and the children have already had some great experiences with visits and trips. Year 2 were transported back to London in 1666 this week, with a visit from the Freshwater Theatre company and Samuel Pepys and Year 6 have been to Broadstone Warren to try their hand at all manner of team building activities. Year 2 also went to Morden Hall country park as part of their learning in Science this term. There are also lots of other trips planned for other year groups. As the weather turns, can I remind parents that children should be coming to school with a coat (with a name label in). It may be nice and warm in the car on the way to school but at playtimes and lunchtimes, unless the weather is really bad, we get the children outside for some fresh air.

Black History Month We have also had a number of workshops and visits as part of our 'Black History' Month' celebrations. This is an annual event that takes place in schools, every October, up and down the country. Our older children had a very inspirational speaker teaching us all about the role of black inventors and scientists all the way back to Ancient Egypt. We've had workshops where we learnt about the history of the steel drum, as well as getting the opportunity to play the steel pans and dance along to some classic tunes. The younger children have had interesting drama workshops where they learnt about the oral tradition of storytelling and Anansi the spider. Alongside work that children will be doing in class, these rich learning experiences have really helped to bring aspects of Black History to life.
