Mobile phones I would like to remind children and parents about our policy towards children having mobile phones in school. The school cannot accept any responsibility for mobile phones in school. As of January, no mobile phones will be allowed in school. Although this has always been the case, we have, in the past, tried to make arrangements to accommodate special circumstances. The collection and storage of mobile phones has now become too onerous for this to be feasible. I'm sure you'll agree that staff having to collect, store and distribute the phones of all the children in year 5 and 6 who go home alone is not a reasonable expectation or a good use of their time. I recognise that many children walk to and from school unsupervised but either you trust them to do that sensibly or you do not. If a child does not arrive at school, the school will contact parents and children can contact working parents once they are home to let them know they have returned safely. Furthermore, police advice is that younger children with mobile phones are more vulnerable because they may be targeted by older children. If you insist that your child brings their phone to school, it will need to be left in the cloakroom with all other personal belongings. If it is seen, it will be collected and returned to an adult who comes to collect it. If it is lost, broken or stolen the school will accept no responsibility.
