## **Dear Parents and Carers.**

Finally, Spring is upon us and we have started to see some better weather. The children have been able to get onto the field and we can get more involved in outdoor activities like today's Sport Relief. It has been a busy time in school and I am always amazed by the range of opportunities and events taking place.
