Firstly, the school is celebrating another great set of results at Key Stage Two. The Year 6 children have made fantastic progress through the key stage and we are proud of them all. Our Key Stage One results were again an improvement on last year and 93% of children passed the Year One phonics screening test. It is testament to all the hard work that staff have put in that these results have been so good and I would like to record my thanks to them all.

As well as academic success, we have a number of other things of which to be proud. The children have been given a wealth of opportunities to take participate in extra curricular activities. For example, Sports and Dance competitions and, for the first time, we have had our Djembe Orchestra and Choir performing at various events. As well as all the wonderful trips and experiences the children partake in, we also celebrated our first ever Museum Day showcasing some of the work the children do in their Thematic curriculum.
