Dear Parents and Carers,

The term continues apace and this week the children have been busy with Maths week. Throughout the school, the children have been setting time aside to use and apply their mathematical knowledge to all sorts of problem solving activities. With everything from children in Year 6 going out and about looking at maths in the environment to children in Year 2 constructing and measuring towers made from spaghetti and marshmallows, there has been a real buzz about the school. A week like this really helps children to put the maths from their lessons into a context and understand why it is important to be a good mathematician.

<u>Mathletics</u> On the subject of maths, many of the children have been working really hard on their mathletics at home. However, some children have mentioned problems logging on at home. At Pegasus Academy Trust the children benefit from what is known as a Universal Sign On (USO). This means that they only have to remember one username and password to access the school computers, Fronter and Mathletics. In order to use their USO to access Mathletics they MUST log in via the 'Single Sign On' page which can be accessed via a link found on Fronter (http://fronter.com/croydon/main.phtml) or on your child's Year Group page on the Pegasus Academy Trust website (http:// www.pegasusacademytrust.org/). DO NOT use the Mathletics sign on page found via Google (http:// www.mathletics.co.uk/); your child's username and password will not work. Logging into a sibling's account: If you have more than one child with a Mathletics account you may find that sometimes when one of them logs on they go into another sibling's account. This usually occurs when the browser hasn't been completely closed at the end of the previous child's session and / or if the browser's cache isn't emptied on closure. To avoid this happening make sure each child closes the browser down when they have finished and that the cache is set to be emptied on closure. An alternative
