Dear Parents and Carers,

It seems that we've only just got back from the Christmas break but already there has been so much going on that three weeks have flown by. There are lots of events coming up too. It has been lovely to see parents coming in to watch the children in their class assemblies and more are on their way. This year parents will also have the opportunity to visit our Museum Day when the children will be sharing the work they have been doing in their thematic lessons. The Internet and social media: As I'm sure you are aware, the issue of staying safe on the internet is something that is a growing concern for schools. This is no longer an issue just for older children as many primary children are increasingly knowledgeable about how to access material on the internet, or through social media, that is not suitable. Please take some time to speak to your child about staying safe online and be aware of what they are using the internet for. Likewise, if your child has access to social media, please make them aware of the consequences of writing and sending things to what is essentially a public forum. Unsupervised access at home has already led to issues in school that we then have to spend time addressing. A good site for information is www.thinkuknow.co.uk/Parentsold/. Ask yourself 'Do you really know what your child is using the internet for?'

In the Event of Snow: Although we haven't had much cold weather so far, we need to remind parents that in the event of extreme weather it may be necessary to close the school. We will always endeavour to keep the school open but sometimes, if staff cannot get in to school or the site becomes unsafe, it may be necessary to close.
