Their role is to help the children cross roads and make sure everyone can get to school safely. They are still learning the ropes so please be patient with them as they get used to what to do. As part of their role, they are trying to make sure that there are safe places for children to cross in Attlee Close. In order to do this, they need to ensure that children do not have to cross in between parked cars. Please support them in keeping the children safe by not parking on the yellow lines. This is illegal and dangerous so they might well ask you to find an alternative parking space. Remember that they are trying to help so if you are asked to move on, please respect them and help us to keep our school community a safe and courteous place by keeping the road clear. Thank you for your cooperation in this.

<u>London Assembly Elections.</u> Please note that the school will be closed on **Thursday the 5th of May.** The school is being used as a polling station and because members of the public will be on the school site we cannot have the children in. Apologies for any inconvenience.

<u>European Referendum</u> As you will no doubt be aware, the 23rd of June has been set aside for voting in a referendum on the UK's membership of the EU. The school is again being used as a polling station and will therefore not be open on that day. I apologise for this additional closure and any inconvenience it may cause but unfortunately we have little option but to support the democratic process. I hope that this early notice gives you time to make alternative child care arrangements. To clarify: the school will be closed to children on **Thursday 23rd June**.
