<u>Parent Questionnaire</u> Once again, we are running our Parental Survey to find out the views of parents and carers. This is a vital piece of work that lets us know how we are doing and what we can do to get better. Please help us to measure our efforts by taking five minutes to complete the questionnaire. Shoes and Trainers A polite reminder of the school's policy on uniform and footwear. The school's prospectus clearly states that: "All children are required to wear school uniform including black shoes. No boots, sandals or trainers are allowed. Black trainers with a sporting brand label are not a substitute for black school shoes." Unfortunately, some children are wearing footwear that is not acceptable as school uniform. Please ensure you provide your child with appropriate footwear to come to school. If you are unable to provide your child with suitable footwear, please speak to Mr Robins. Alternatively, the school will provide your child with footwear that is suitable for wear in school. If your child has a medical condition that precludes them from wearing the correct footwear, please speak to Mr Robins and we shall consider a medical exemption. At the time of the last parental survey, (2015) over 90% of parents strongly agreed with their child wearing school uniform. In light of this, I'm sure you will agree it is important to reinforce our school's uniform policy and make sure that everyone maintains the high standards we have set ourselves.

We need committed people who are prepared to use their interest to challenge the school leadership and help drive things forward.
