Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a hectic start to the summer term with lots of exciting things happening. We've had visits from cavemen, who came to see Year 3, and the school has been full of creepy crawlies and nocturnal creatures. 'Zoolab' visited the Reception children and 'Animal Magic' visited Year 2. The children had the opportunity to handle snails, cockroaches, rabbits, mice and even a snake, as well as learning about how these animals live.
