**Head Lice Advice**. As with all schools up and down the country, we occasionally have head lice in school. Head lice are very common, particularly in school age children, and are not linked to dirty hair or poor hygiene. In fact, about 10% of the population have head lice at any one time. Although head lice can be upsetting, they are not harmful and can only be spread by hair to hair contact as they cannot fly or jump. According to the NHS, the best way to prevent head lice becoming a problem is for all parents to undertake regular 'detection combing' as part of your child's normal hygiene routine. Also, keeping long hair tied up can help prevent their spread. If you do find that your child has head lice, your pharmacist will be able to advise you on the best treatments. Further advice can be found on the NHS choices website. Please help us to limit the spread of head lice in school by regularly checking your child and treating where necessary. The holiday break presents the ideal opportunity to have a check.
