## SUMMARY OF PUPIL PREMIUM PUPILS AND THEIR PROGRESS

#### Measuring the impact of the Pupil Premium Grant

We have evaluated the impact of pupil premium (PP) spending on each pupil. Evaluation focused on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the interventions.

#### **Pupil Premium analysis 2015**

**Year 1 Phonics screening check**- 80% pass for PPG, (compared to 65 nationally) 87% pass for non-PPG (compared to 79% nationally). A gap of 7 points, nationally this gap was 15 points in 2015.\* Note that gaps are calculated from unrounded data.

In reading, writing and maths disadvantaged pupils made better progress than children who didn't receive pupil premium funding and their progress was in line or better than the progress of pupils who didn't receive the funding nationally.
