We have been treated to class assemblies from Meteors and Planets class and it has been lovely to welcome parents into the school to see their children perform and hear about what the children have been learning. <u>Cinderella's wedding</u>: Year One celebrated the wedding of Cinderella and Prince Charming last week. <u>Year 4 to the British Wildlife Centre:</u> As part of their ongoing Science work on habitats, Year Four went on a visit to the British Wildlife Centre last week. The centre houses species that live in Britain but many of them are rarely seen. Pupils were able to see and learn about a huge variety of natural British wildlife such as foxes, deer, badgers, red squirrels, otters, pole cats, harvest mice, hedgehogs and even a pair of Scottish wildcats! The children heard all about the animals and how they live from the keepers. Everyone had a great time despite the freezing weather. Maybe, next year, they'll be able to visit in the Spring or Summer.
