#### **Dear Parents and Carers,**

This week the governors at Whitehorse Infant and Junior schools held an Extraordinary General Meeting to consider the possibility of forming a new partnership with Ecclesbourne Primary School, which you will know is the nearest primary school to us. The governors at Ecclesbourne have also considered the advantages of such a partnership and all three governing bodies overwhelmingly passed the motion that they agree 'pending consultation, to apply for new academy status with the Department for Education'. The move to become a new academy is an exciting development and, if agreed, will mean that all three schools work much more closely together for the benefit of children and families in Thornton Heath. The Headteachers and governors at all three schools are keen to hear everyone's views but parents and carers should be assured that many of the changes are legal and organisational and that we are committed to ensuring that the only impact on their children's education is a continued improvement in the quality of the educational experience offered by the schools. We are supported in our move to explore new academy status by the Local Authority as well as the central government Department for Education who believe that this is a proven route to ongoing school improvement and a good way of developing school partnerships.

Croydon's Children, Young People and Learners department writes: 'Croydon Local Authority welcomes this expression of partnership by the governors of the school communities of Whitehorse Manor Infant School, Ecclesbourne Primary School and Whitehorse Manor Junior School. They are fully supportive of a healthy debate about the benefits of any 'New Academy' model and what it might offer the children and families of all three schools. The Local Authority is fully supportive of the action taken by governors to proceed to consultation on this matter'

The next stage is to arrange for all members of our school communities to have a chance to share their views and opportunities to do this will be arranged in due course.
