Dear Parents and Carers,

The half term has sped by and autumn is really upon us! Children in all year groups have enjoyed a range of special events, visitors and trips. Year 5 was invaded by Romans and Year 6 enjoyed their annual team building day at Broadstone Warren. Our annual Remembrance Day service will be held on Monday 11th November 2012 from 10.45 am, with a two minute silence at 11.00am. All parents are most welcome to join us. I hope that the half term offers you the chance to relax and recuperate before the count down to Christmas begins in earnest.

Mathletics: 'Mathletics' has been our maths homework at WHJUN for the last 5 years. Teachers set homework tasks for pupils and once these are completed pupils are then free to work on other areas of maths. It has always been our expectation that children earn a 'bronze certificate' worth 1000 points each week, where each activity usually earns around 200 points. There is a real link between progress in maths and regular completion of this homework. Children need access to a computer to complete this homework, but it can also be completed on a tablet such as an iPad, or on a smartphone. Unfortunately, there has been a drop in the number of pupils earning 1000 points, despite the fact that this achievement is celebrated in assembly every Wednesday, with classes competing against each other. Mathletics scores are also reported on end of year reports. Please make sure that your child is doing this homework. If your child does not have access to a computer, please see Mrs Vanner who organises our lunchtime homework club to see if we can help with computer access.

<u>Charity at Whitehorse:</u> Our Macmillan Coffee Morning was a great success and helped raise £130 for this worthy cause. I'd also like to thank everyone who donated goods for our Harvest Festival. These have now been passed on to local charities to be distributed within the local community. Well done to 4H for a memorable Harvest Assembly.
