**Uniform:** Please ensure that all items of uniform are clearly labelled with your child's name. We have already generated some lost property this week! Tracking down owners is time consuming for us, distressing for the child who has misplaced an item of clothing and expensive for you if you need to buy more – a name label makes all the difference. Although I understand that it's getting more and more difficult to tell the difference between black trainers and school shoes, please avoid 'school shoes' made by sporting brands, as these are often more trainer than school shoe. If your child has a medical reason for wearing trainers, please bring in a letter from your orthopaedic specialist, podiatrist or GP. This way we can ensure that all children are treated fairly. Our full uniform policy is in our prospectus which is available on the website.

**Reading homework:** The most important homework that your child can do every evening is to read. All the research suggests that children who read for 15 minutes per evening, and children who have stories read to them, do better at school in the long term. Children in the juniors have homework reading diaries to record what pages they have read and to make comments on what they have read. Please support you child with their daily reading homework.
