Uniform and PE kits

Punctuality and attendance

The school opens for reception to year 3 at 8:45am to allow children to filter in from this time and start their early work. Children should be collected promptly at 3:15pm by an **adult who is known to us**. If anyone different is going to collect your child please let us know. We **will not** let a child leave school with an adult we do not know. If your child is absent from school please inform the office as soon as possible and provide a written note of the reason for the absence when your child returns to school.

We will always endeavour to keep the school open but sometimes, if staff cannot get in to school or the site becomes unsafe, it may be necessary to close.
