The school has had some very sad news this weekend as we have been informed that our former Deputy Headteacher, Teresa McBain, passed away on Saturday. Miss McBain retired 5 years ago having been deputy at the school for 28 years and although lots of our current children won't know Miss McBain, older brothers and sisters may well have been taught by her as well as some of our mums and dads. She was, guite simply, the heart of this school for many years and was acting Headteacher twice. Although these days everyone thinks of the Whitehorse schools as successful this wasn't always the case and Miss McBain was the outstanding teacher who kept the junior school going through those darker times. I have no hesitation in saving that we would not be as highly regarded as we are as a school without the foundation work of Miss McBain. She was Deputy in my first 2 years as head here and I found her a supportive, knowledgeable colleague. She was first and foremost an excellent teacher with a particular soft spot for the more difficult children. She was always prepared to give her own time to make sure that the children had a fully rounded school experience and ran lots of extra curricular clubs and trips. She was a great champion of school sport and ran our football teams for many years-to see Miss McBain in full 'coaching mode' on the touchline was a sight to behold! Her dedication to this school was complete as shown by her years of service and the fact that when I arrived, even though Miss McBain was approaching retirement, she was still the first member of staff here in the morning and the last to leave. She had a tremendous impact on the guality of education for children in this school for many, many years. We owe Miss McBain a great debt of gratitude and we will miss her as a great friend and colleague.
