PE kits and school uniform

Please ensure your children have plimsolls, a white tee shirt and black shorts for PE lessons and these, along with all items of school uniform, **are named**. If uniform is named and goes missing it usually makes its way back to the owner. As the weather becomes colder, children can wear tracksuits when doing PE outside. **Stud earrings** are the only jewellery which can be worn at any time in school. Please make sure that coats and sweatshirts are also clearly named.

Punctuality and attendance

The school opens at 8:45am to allow children to filter in from this time. Any child who arrives after **9:00am** is late for school and must be brought to the office where the lateness can be recorded. Children should be collected promptly at 3:15pm by an adult who is known to us. If anyone different is going to collect your child please let us know. We will not let a child leave school with an adult we do not know. If your child is absent from school please inform the office as soon as possible and provide a written note of the reason for the absence when your child returns to school.

A birthday book

Although we are a healthy school, I accept that parents sometimes like to send in a 'sweet treat' to mark their child's birthday. Treats are always sent home, so that individual parents/carers can decide if they want their child to eat them. However, we are trying to promote a far better idea. It's called 'A Birthday Book'. If you want to mark your child's birthday in school, in a special way, send in a children's book for the class book corner instead of a sweets/cake. The whole class can sign it and then your child's birthday is remembered throughout the year when children borrow the book. This also has the bonus of being a cheaper option for parents/carers too!
