


Ascenders (they are tall letters)




Descenders (they continue below the line)




'i' has 2 shapes – one when it's on its own and one when it's in a word:



Other letters of the alphabet fit in this size of box:



Capital letters have a bigger box (you need them for things like names)




Where the boxes change colour on the adult list this shows a different sound in the word string – e.g. 'ack' becomes 'eck' – 'back' becomes 'beck'. The changes can come at the beginning, middle or end of the word.









