SUMMARY OF PUPIL PREMIUM PUPILS

Measuring the impact of PPG

We have evaluated the impact of pupil premium (PP) spending on each pupil. Evaluation focused on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the interventions.

Pupil Premium analysis 2016

Year 1 Phonics screening check- 58% pass for PPG, (compared to 66% nationally) 75% pass for non-PPG (compared to 80% nationally), a gap of 17 points. Nationally this gap was 14 points in 2015.* Note that gaps are calculated from unrounded data. (National figures are from previous year's data)

At KS1 a new assessment framework was in place and comparisons with previous years cannot be made. National figures are not available as of September 2016
