## SUMMARY OF PUPIL PREMIUM PUPILS AND THEIR ATTAINMENT AND PROGRESS

### Measuring the impact of the Pupil Premium Grant

We have evaluated the impact of pupil premium (PP) spending on each pupil. Evaluation focused on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the interventions. At KS2 a new assessment framework was in place and comparisons with previous years cannot be made.
