

## **Year 2 Termly Newsletter**

Autumn 2015

Welcome to Year Two! We hope you had a fantastic summer and we look forward to having a wonderful year working together.

During the autumn term we will be working hard in English to develop the children's reading, writing and speaking and listening. We will be reading a number of fictional texts such as "Six Dinner Sid" and "George's Marvellous Medicine" to inspire our story writing and love of reading. We will also be researching and fact finding using a wide range of non-fiction books, looking closely at our history topic which this term will be 'The Great Fire of London' and writing diaries in the style of an eye witness to the fire. Every week, the children will be learning about different aspects of spelling, grammar and punctuation and using this to improve their writing skills. The most important way you can support your child is by reading with them as often as possible. Your child will have the opportunity to change their reading book in their book bag on a daily basis. It is essential that you listen to them read aloud and also that you read to them. Please try and write in your child's reading diary on a weekly basis to keep us informed of their reading at home.

In our maths work this term, the children will be focusing on place value (e.g. to know that the number 523 is made up of 3 digits that tell us how many hundreds, tens and units there are in the number and that 523 = 500 + 20 + 3) as well as looking at different ways we can add and subtract numbers. Please help your child with as much practical maths as possible; remembering that it is important that they can explain the method they used to solve a calculation. We will also work on visualising and describing 2D (triangle, square, circle) and 3D (sphere, cube, cone) shapes and collect information that will be recorded in tally charts and block graphs.

This term we are 'Looking at London'. This topic will cover all of our work in art, design and technology, history and geography. In history, we will be learning about 'The Great Fire of London', when it happened and why and how it affected London. In October, the Freshwater Theatre Company will be visiting us to help us learn more about our topic through drama. In geography the children will look at where London is, learn about some of its significant landmarks and why it is an important city. We will be taking a trip to London on the train to see some of the landmarks for ourselves next half term and will be visiting "The Monument" next to London Bridge, which was built to commemorate where the fire started. In our design and technology and art work we will be making pictures of the fire and a silhouette of the London skyline.

In science, our work will be about "Living things and their habitats" and we will be learning that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants. As part of this work we will be taking the children to explore different natural environments at Morden Hall Park..

Dates for all of the exciting trips we have arranged will follow shortly. We look forward to an exciting year ahead!

There will be a chance for you to meet with your child's teacher this half term to talk through their next steps for learning. These will be taking place on **Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> October**. We also look forward to seeing you on **Wednesday 14th<sup>th</sup> October at 9.15am** for a meeting to give out information about the year two curriculum and also to look at the new SATs (Standard Assessment Tests) the children will be taking next spring.
