#### **SUMMARY OF PUPIL PREMIUM PUPILS**

#### Measuring the impact of PPG

We have evaluated the impact of pupil premium (PP) spending on each pupil. Evaluation focused on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a result of the interventions.

### **Pupil Premium analysis 2018**

**Year 1 Phonics screening check**- 95% of all pupils met the threshold for the PSC compared to 84% nationally.

100% of Beulah PPG pupils met the threshold compared with 93% of our non-PPG pupils. Beulah PPG pupils outperformed our non-PPG with a positive gap of +7%.

Nationally 70% of PPG pupils met the standard compared with 84% of non-PPG pupils. Nationally the gap between PPG and non-PPG was 14%.

**Year 2 Phonics screening check (cumulative)** 97% for all pupils. Nationally this was 92%. 95% PPG pupils passed the PSC compared with 98% for non-PPG pupils. Nationally 84% PPG pupils passed the PSC compared with 93% for non-PPG pupils. Nationally the gap was 9%
