SUMMARY OF PUPIL PREMIUM PUPILS AND THEIR PROGRESS

Measuring the impact of the Pupil Premium Grant

We have evaluated the impact of pupil premium (PP) spending on each pupil. Evaluation focused on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the interventions.

Pupil Premium analysis 2017

Year 1 Phonics screening check- 88% of all pupils met the threshold for the PSC compared to 81% nationally. 89% of PPG pupils met the threshold. PPG children performed better than non PPG children by 2%. 68% of PPG pupils met the standard nationally compared with 84% of non-PPG pupils. Nationally this gap was -16%.

Year 2 Phonics screening check (cumulative)- 91% for all pupils. Nationally this was 92%. 50% PPG pupils passed the PSC compared with 60% for non-PPG pupils. Still awaiting national data for comparison purposes.

Impact of Pupil Premium on pupil attainment and progress 2016/17

Pupil premium children performed as well as, or better than, non-pupil premium children in all areas at Key Stage Two. They also made better progress than non-pupil premium children did except in writing where the difference was minimal.
