**Uniform matters**: As the winter gets underway, just a brief reminder about our policy on footwear. Boots and trainers are not part of our school uniform and children should not come to school wearing them. Children's school shoes should be robust enough to deal with rain, the walk to school and playtimes. In times of really adverse weather, such as snow or torrential rain, children can wear suitable boots to school, but are expected to change out of them and into their normal school shoes once at school. If your child has an orthopaedic medical condition that requires them to wear supportive, lace-up boots in order to correct this, please give a copy of the letter from their specialist to their class teacher and we will make an exception, based on their medical need. **Please, please, label all clothing**.
