NOTE FROM THE TEACHER

Welcome back to all of our returning families and a very warm welcome to those who are new to the Trust. It has been great to see the children beginning to settle in as they begin their school journey with us. We like to write to you to keep you informed of what your child will be learning about as well as to make you aware of any upcoming events. Our topic this half term is **'If You're Happy and You Know It'** where the children will have the opportunity to learn some nursery rhymes and share some of our favourite stories.

WHAT WE'RE LEARNING

Communication & Language

Over the next half term, the children will be reciting some everyday nursery rhymes such as 'If you're happy and you know it' and listening to stories that focus on repeated refrains. All of this work will help to develop their speaking and listening skills and we will be encouraging them to join in with the songs and stories. We will also be working on building their communication skills when making friends and sharing with one another. Whilst playing alongside the children, adults will be modelling friendly language and encouraging the children to communicate effectively with each other.

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

As the children enter the nursery environment we will be working on familiarising them with the space and the rules and routines associated with it. They will specifically learn how to show positive behaviours both in their learning and in their interactions with peers and adults. We will be focussing on how to take turns and share, with support, when using toys and equipment.

Physical Development

During the school day, we will be encouraging the children to use our outside equipment to improve their gross motor skills. This will include climbing equipment, bikes, stilts and hula hoops. These activities help improve their gross motor skills and build important muscles that then support their fine motor skills for writing. Alongside this, we will be working on their fine motor development focussing on activities that will build the muscles in their hands and encourage them to begin mark making purposely.

Literacy

This half term, we will be sharing lots of stories with the children and focussing on a few key texts. 'Owl Babies' by Martin Waddell and 'Peace at Last' by Jill Murphy are particular favourites! We will be encouraging discussions around books, fostering a love of reading and supporting the children in enjoying sharing stories. As we enter Autumn 2, we will begin to introduce 'Foundation of Phonics' based activities to encourage their sound awareness and oral blending. However, during this term we know it is important to focus on communication and language within our literacy sessions to set a firm foundation for the next steps. A parental workshop explaining more about how we teach reading will take place this half term. We will also be learning nursery rhymes and encouraging the children to join in with each song, focussing on new vocabulary and performance skills.

Maths

In mathematics, we will be practising our counting skills and introducing numbers 1-5. We will be looking at different representations of amounts 1-5 and also working on counting objects successfully to 5. We do this practically with interesting objects for the children to play with and setting up opportunities to count within our environments. When teaching each number we also use a variety of songs, which we are sure the children will begin to sing at home for you!

Understanding the World

In this area of learning, we will be observing the world around us, in particular our new nursery environment and asking questions about why things happen and how things work. We will be getting to know the staff at school and what they do so that we know who to speak to if we need help.

Expressive Arts & Design

In art and design, we will be exploring all the new materials, equipment and resources we have access to in our classrooms. We will be letting the children experiment with these and, with support, create their own art work. We will also be using the nursery rhymes we are learning to practise our performance skills and make up our own actions to the songs
