Site Update

If you have visited the Upper Site, you will notice there are some changes underway. The steps from the year 3 classrooms to the top playground are now complete and work has begun on a ramp and steps which will eventually form the entrance to the new school office.

At the Lower site our landscape gardeners were busy outside at Cypress Lower continuing the work to make our woodland more accessible and useable for outdoor education. Our woodland has lots of potential to be a place where, despite being city dwellers, our children can learn a lot more about the natural world and how to look after it. To this end we have: replaced the old pond including a pond dipping area, identified a bluebell wood, added a new plantings to encourage more insects and birds and improved the drainage. There will now be a quiet period of peace and quiet to allow the plants in the new area to establish and wildlife to find the pond. We hope the children will be able to make their first visits later in the summer.

Keeping us all safe in school

In order to keep all members of our school community safe, we are now working in class bubbles. We have also reduced the amount of furniture in the classrooms to provide more space for the adults and children to maintain an appropriate distance. At the Lower school the lunch time rota has been changed so that class bubbles can be maintained. Green, Blue, Ruby and Violet classes are eating in their classrooms until we review the situation at Easter; the children are loving this novelty and our caterers are doing an excellent job at adapting the service so that we can all stay safe. We have also drawn on the children's excellent IT skills and use GoogleMeets for cross class group interventions using the chrome books! We are so impressed with the children's independence in this area of their learning!
