## SUMMARY OF PUPIL PREMIUM PUPILS

### Measuring the impact of PPG

We have evaluated the impact of pupil premium (PP) spending on each pupil. Evaluation focused on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a result of the interventions.

### Pupil Premium analysis 2018

**Year 1 Phonics screening check** - 77% of all pupils met the threshold for the PSC compared to 83% nationally. Non-PPG children performed better than PPG children by 8%. 70% of PPG pupils met the standard nationally compared with 78% of non-PPG pupils. Nationally this gap was -13%.

**Year 2 Phonics screening check (cumulative)** - 93% for all pupils. Nationally this was 92%. 78% PPG pupils passed the PSC compared with 95% for non-PPG pupils.

**Impact of Pupil Premium on pupil attainment and progress 2017/18**

Pupil premium children performed better than pupil premium children nationally in RWM combined at Key Stage Two. They are also well above the floor standard in progress across all 3 areas nationally.
