This week we started with baby and toddler yoga and launched our Junior Jam sessions. We are also currently offering a parental ESOL course. We then redistribute this for free. We never know what we are going to get but all are welcome to come and help themselves. All we ask is that you are mindful of only taking what you need so that we can help as many as possible and that you remember to bring a carrier bag so that we don't have to issue environmentally damaging plastic bags.

<u>Pre-loved Uniform</u> We have been given a selection of pre-loved uniform. Although it is second hand, it is in good condition and we will be giving it away free. This will also be available for people to help themselves to on Wednesdays after school so come and have a look. If you have any uniform at home that children have grown out of but is still in good condition, we would love to have it to help other families and reduce the environmental impact of people repeatedly buying new clothes. Please make sure that any donations are clean and in good condition and we will try to redistribute them.
