If you are thinking about getting your child a phone for Christmas or you already let your child use social media on their phone, please take the time to talk to them about how to use it responsibly and regularly check to see that they are following your advice. This will help to keep your child safe and prevent problems arising that can affect their friendships and learning in school.

The feedback from people who attended was that they found the information provided extremely helpful.
