<u>Charity and giving</u>: A big thank you to everyone who has supported our charity events this halfterm. Across the Whitehorse schools we raised £220 with our raffle and cake sale for the Macmillan Cancer charity. Despite the cost of living crisis, we received many donations for Harvest Festival and these donations have been passed to Fr Sean Gilbert at St Albans' Church for their food bank at the church, just down the road from the school in Thornton Heath.

<u>Lunch Charges:</u> Unfortunately, the office inform me that a lot of time is still spent chasing parents to pay for school lunches. School dinners need to be pre-booked on Magic Booking and paid for IN ADVANCE. A reminder is sent out to parents on Sunday evening reminding them to pay for the week ahead. Not paying in advance causes all kinds of problems for the system and confusion when late charges are added to accounts; this then requires a lot of admin time, including calling parents to remind them. Please book in advance, as requested.

<u>hew house and vice captains</u>: As usual, there were some very strong contenders for the roles of House Captain and Vice Captain this year. To be honest, there were no losers in this contest, as all the children who stood for office presented themselves exceedingly well and we now have a great student leadership group, comprising house and vice-captains and monitors, all of whom are members of our school council. <u>Time keeping:</u> The school opens at 8.45am and children should aim to be in on time to benefit from early work. We try to get the children out on time at the end of the school day and children need to be collected promptly at 3.15pm. Let the office know if something unforeseen has occurred to delay you, but please remember that staff have other commitments after school and shouldn't be expected to wait with children.

<u>Break-time snacks and Breakfast bagels</u>: Children are welcome to bring a piece of fresh fruit as a snack at break-time and apples are on sale at a cost of 20p. This half -term we have also introduced the National Breakfast Scheme which provides half a plain bagel with dairy free spread every morning if children want it. I know that most of our children eat breakfast at home, but this is a 'safety net' to ensure that there is something available for those that don't.

<u>Homework:</u> Mathletics is our expected weekly maths homework, although there are still some children who do not regularly earn their 1000 points each week. Mathletics still works during the holidays, so encourage your child to spend some time on this over the break. Mathletics 'Live' is particularly good at building mental maths skills. If your child has any problems accessing Mathletics, please let their class teacher know so we can see if this is an admin issue that we can fix. Also, don't forget to get your children to READ, READ, READ - reading regularly is still the best homework for primary-aged pupils and linked to better outcomes in learning.
