- Ask your child
- Daily contact with staff
- Parents' meetings
- Newsletters
- Website

How you help at home

- Model good speaking and listening skills. Talk to your child all the time!
- > Read to your child every day
- > Let your child see you writing for a purpose
- > Encourage large scale movements
- > Point out numbers of personal significance
- > Talk about the print you see in the environment
- > Look for examples of shapes in the environment
- > Talk about getting along and playing with others
- > Encourage independence when dressing and undressing
- > Limit the amount of screen time
- > Reasonable and set bed times

Top tips to help with reading

- > Choose a quiet time
- Make reading enjoyable
- Regular sharing of books
- > Talk about the books
- Stick to what they know/like
- > Be positive and encouraging
- > Start with your child's interests

Getting ready for reception

- Recognising their name
- Copying their name
- Writing their name independently
- > Rote count to 5
- > Recognise numerals to 5
- Safely use one handed tools such as scissors to make snips in paper
