Year 6 Termly Newsletter: Summer 2025

Summer has finally arrived! We hope that you have had a lovely Easter break. We hope that this newsletter will help to keep you informed about what your children will be learning this term. If we need to share information with you, we will use Studybugs, so please make sure we have an up-to-date mobile phone number for you.

English: This term the children will continue their study of 'Wolf Brother' by Michelle Paver. They will be writing in a range of genres; we will continue to focus on excellent sentence construction and developing ideas within their writing to interest the reader. During the second half of this term, we will be reading Greek myths and preparing for secondary school with poetry from Rachel Rooney's 'A Kid in My Class' and 'The Boy who made Everyone Laugh' by Helen Rutter.

Maths: With the SATs approaching (Monday 12th May–Thursday 15th May), we will be focusing on revision. It would be wonderful if you could support your child at home. Some areas that you might wish to cover with them include: multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1,000; calculations involving addition, subtraction, multiplication, and both long and short division; comparing and ordering decimals; rounding whole numbers and decimals; and calculations involving decimals. Mathletics is a fantastic tool to help with revision and here are some websites that you might find useful:

Once the SATs are over, the children will extend their knowledge of ratio and proportion and algebra. We will also complete challenging open-ended investigations to develop their independent skills.

Science: Our science topics for this term are 'Light' and 'Electricity'. During our study of light, we will be studying how light moves and how we see colour as well as investigating reflection, refraction and shadows. When we study electricity, we will be exploring how to build and use a variety of circuits and will be completing an investigation based on this knowledge. As part of our statutory national curriculum, we will be learning about relationship and sex education.

Thematic: This term our theme is: Greece is the Word. We will be learning about the location, geography and climate of Greece, and investigating the politics of Ancient Greece. We will also be learning about the wonderful world of Greek Gods as well as depicting myths and mythological beasts using our knowledge of levers and artistic techniques. The British Museum has a wonderful collection of Ancient Greek artefacts; you might wish to visit the museum with your child during the next few months.

Trips and events: The summer term always brings us many exciting events, including post-SATs celebrations and creative activities. We also have all of the end of year events to look forward to such as the Chessington trip, Year 6 production, the leavers' party and the leavers' assembly (which always brings out a tear or two from both staff and parents). The whole school is looking forward to cheering on their teams at Sports' Day and the Croydon Sports Athletics Competition. Additionally, we are looking forward to our visits to the National Gallery.

What you can do to help: Please make sure that your child reads every night and signs their reading diary at the end of the week. Regular reading is proven to improve children's learning. Ask them questions about what they've read, what they think the words mean or what the character might be thinking or feeling. Lists of spelling words for each year group are available and children are expected to know these by the end of the year. Times tables need constant revision - children should know these facts instantly, in mixed order, and know the corresponding division fact. 'Mathletics' is our on-line maths homework. Children are expected to earn 1000 points each week. 'Live' Mathletics is particularly good for developing mental maths skills. Additionally, helping your children to complete their thematic homework is a wonderful way of spending time with your child whilst supporting their learning.
