Punctuality and attendance

The school opens at 8:45am. Any child who arrives after **9:00am** is late for school and **must be brought to the office by a parent or carer where the lateness can be noted**. Children should be collected promptly at 3:15pm by an adult who is known to us. If anyone different is going to collect your child please let us know. We will not let a child leave school with an adult we do not know. If your child is absent from school please record this on Studybugs or inform the office as soon as possible. Where possible we ask that you make medical appointments for your child outside of the school day. It is important for children to maximise their time in school so that they have the best outcomes. PE kits

On PE days the children are expected to wear their PE kits to school. They should still wear their school sweatshirt or jumper over their PE t-shirt. Now that the weather is colder, a pair of plain black jogging bottoms would be preferable to shorts. Please do not send your child in with non-uniform track suits.

These are taking place on Tuesday 10th and Thursday 12th March. There is an expectation that parents attend Parents' Evening. Parents' Evening is an opportunity to look at your child's work and for staff to share with you how your child is doing.

World Book Week

On **Monday 2nd March**, to start Book Week, children can come to school dressed as their favourite book character or in their favourite Pyjamas.

Birthdays

Due to the high number of food allergies in our school, we will only give out party bags, which contain **non-food** items. Our preference would be a book donation for the class to share to celebrate a child's birthday. We ask that parents do not give out party bags with food in them on the school playground.

Reading is a fundamental life skill that we want children to develop and improve within EYFS and KS1. We ensure that Reading is a priority within our curriculum; not only through Phonics lessons but through our English and Reading lessons. In order to support us with this, we ask that every child reads at home to an adult **every day** i.e. 10 minutes a day. Your child is bringing home a carefully selected Little Wandle book each week. This consolidates the reading that has happened during the week. It is important the children have an opportunity to share this book, in which you can talk to them about the characters, the events in the story, the vocabulary and share their success with reading and phonics knowledge. A time to celebrate! We ask that the **reading diary is completed each day** with a short comment about the reading or the pages that have been read. Your comments can also include any words that the children found challenging.

Please ensure that the reading diary and book are returned to school on a daily basis.
