On Friday 19<sup>th</sup> March we will be taking part in Red Nose Day, raising money for Comic Relief, a UK charity with the vision of a world free of poverty. We are asking children to **donate £1** and come dressed in as much red clothing as possible (anything with red on) and/or to wear any Red Nose Day merchandise that you have at home. We are not selling noses this year - they are available in supermarkets and children are, of course, welcome to wear these too. We look forward to seeing everyone dressed in their red/comic relief finery!

**Keeping us all safe:** At the end of the school day the period between 3.15pm and 3.30pm is the most crowded, with some parents still coming in, whilst others are leaving - **if you are exiting at this time please use the lower path from the canopy area** - there are stairs down from the canopy or the slope for prams. Using the bottom path to exit will help to maintain safe distances and prevent congestion on the top path when people try to enter and exit at the same time. **Please wear a face covering when on the school premises.** If anyone in your household has symptoms or tests positive the whole household must self-isolate for 10 days - please don't send your child into school if they are feeling unwell as this puts the whole school community at risk.

**Contact details:** If you have changed your contact details, including email address, please let the school office know so we can update our records. We have a school parent texting service so please ensure we have your current mobile phone details.

**Mid-morning snacks:** Please send your child in with a **fruit snack** for mid-morning break. The government doesn't provide free fruit in Key Stage 2, but children are welcome and encouraged to bring in something to eat - fresh or dried fruit, but no nuts please. We also sell apples for 20p most mornings. It can be a long time between breakfast and lunch.
