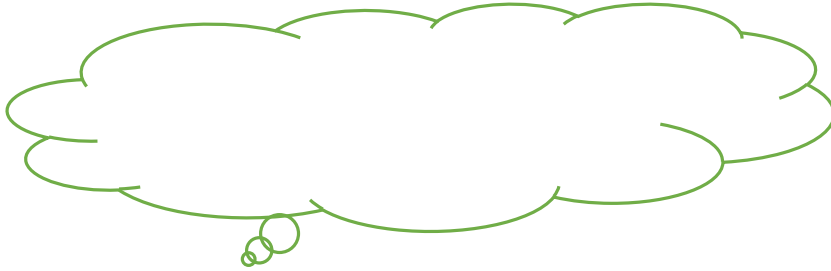


Wolf Brother chapter 31 – comprehension
