Y3 Caveman Extravaganza



Year 3 will be hosting a Caveman Extravaganza in a specially designed outdoor classroom for our Thematic Stone Age topic. The cavepeople will be based on the field in their interactive tent at Atwood on Friday 13th June. This amazing opportunity will enrich children's understanding of this time period through immersive, hands-on activities.

The children will enter the Stone-Age classroom through an archway of ancient paintings to emerge into another world! The floor will be lined with the skins of hunted animals, walls will be painted with scenes from ancient times and everyday objects from thousands of years ago will be on display for children to explore!

The experience will begin by introducing the children to the timeline expanding from the Palaeolithic connecting to the Neolithic age and beyond. After orientating the class as to where they are in 'time', they will move on to life in the stone age and the skills and abilities it took to survive.
