## Year 3 Termly Newsletter: Autumn 2025



**W**elcome to Year 3. We hope that you have had a restful summer and we look forward to a wonderful year working together. We hope that this newsletter will help to keep you informed about what your children will be learning this term. If we need to share information with you, we will use 'Studybugs' so please make sure you download the app. If this is not possible, please ensure we have an up to date email. **English:** We will be working hard in literacy to develop the children's reading and writing. With this aim in mind, we will be reading a number of exciting fictional texts this term such as *Into the Forest* by Anthony Browne, *The Boy who grew Dragons* by Andy Shepherd and *Fantastic Mr Fox* by Roald Dahl. Through our work with these texts, the children will develop their ability to write short narratives, instructions and descriptions. We will also be learning how to write and punctuate dialogue between characters. As well as our fictional texts, the children will explore non-fiction texts linked to dinosaurs which also links to our thematic topic and the infamous dinosaur park at Crystal Palace Park. We will also be practising our *prosody* (reading with expression) using performance poetry as a stimulus.

**Maths:** In our maths learning this term, the children will be solely focusing on number. In Year 3, we feel it is very important for children to fully understand the place value of numbers before focusing on other skills. Therefore, in the first half term, the children will learn about representing, partitioning and ordering and comparing 2 and 3 digit numbers. When the children are ready, we will build on this knowledge and use the expanded column method to solve 2 and 3 digit addition and subtraction problems. All of these skills will give the children a good foundation at the start of Key Stage 2 so that they are prepared when we move onto applying these skills to real life problems.

**Science:** Our science topics for this term are *Animals including Humans* and *Forces and Magnets*. During our study of Animals including Humans, we will be learning about the human diet and what nutrients the body needs. The children will learn the three main functions of the human skeleton alongside some of the names of the bones. Within the Forces and Magnets unit, the children will discover what a force is as well as how magnets work. Working as scientists and undertaking investigations will consolidate this learning.

**Thematic:** This term our theme is *The Crystal Palace*. In history, we will be creating a timeline to situate the Crystal Palace within its historical perspective as well as studying the huge significance and effects of the Industrial Revolution. In geography, we will explore national and international maps using compass skills to identify the participating countries of the Great Exhibition. In Art, the children will use their newly learned sketching skills to create pencil drawings of the Crystal Palace for the front covers of their sketch books. In Design and Technology, children will have the opportunity to design, plan and build a bridge based on the work of Victorian architect Isambard Kingdom Brunel. Places of interest linked to our theme that you could visit with your child are Crystal Palace Park, Thornton Heath library or the National Gallery in London.

**Trips and events:** We have two exciting experiences planned for this term. In the first half term, we hope to organise for each school to have a visitor from the Crystal Palace Park museum. The park is currently undergoing huge restoration and many areas are closed; we hope to visit after Christmas (weather permitting) when the dinosaur walk and museum are due to reopen. After half term, we will be visiting the V&A museum in South Kensington to explore Victorian art and artefacts from the Great Exhibition.

**What you can do to help:** Please make sure that your child reads every night and that you sign their reading diary at the end of each week. Regular reading is proven to improve children's learning. Ask them questions about what they've read. Ask them what they think the words mean or what the character might be thinking or feeling. Please make every night a reading night! Lists of spelling words for each year group are printed in your child's reading diary and children are expected to know these by the end of the year. Times tables need constant revision - children should know these facts instantly, in mixed order, and know the corresponding division fact. 'Mathletics' is our online maths homework and will be introduced soon. Children are expected to earn 1,000 points (a bronze certificate) each week but are welcome to earn more points! 'Live' Mathletics is particularly good for developing mental maths skills. Additionally, helping your children to complete their thematic homework is a wonderful way of spending time with your child whilst supporting their learning.
