## Are we getting enough sleep?

In an exclusive report for EPS News, Aliyah looks at the science behind how much sleep we actually need.

#### How much sleep do we need?

We all need lots of sleep but we aren't all supposed to get the same amount? If you are a child, the amount of sleep you need is around 11-12 hours. Adults aren't supposed to have as much sleep as children but they do need to have a certain amount. Women are supposed to get 8-9 hours and men need 6-7 hours each night. This is because a woman's brain collects and stores more information during the day than a man's. If a woman gets too

little sleep then this can cause them to have a migraine because it strains their brains.

This does not mean that men are less intelligent than women; it just means that during the day, a woman's



brain absorbs more information.

This day was so much fun because the activities we did in class were very different to normal. Some classes were reading their favourite superhero books. There was also a half price book sale




for children and parents to buy the books they have always wanted.

During assembly, we got a chance to look at everybody's costumes. Spiderman was the most popular costume and


loads of people were dressed up



Lived: 25 October 1881-8 April 1973

Pablo Ruiz Picasso was a Spanish painter, sculptor, printmaker, ceramicist, stage designer, poet and playwright, who spent most of his adult life in France. His most famous quote is, "everything you can imagine is real." When he was nearly 50, the Spanish born artist had become the most well-known name in modern art, with the most distinct style and eye for artistic creation. Picasso's ability to produce works in an astonishing range of styles made him well respected during his lifetime. After his death in 1973, his value as an artist and inspiration to other artists has only grown. Throughout the long course of his career, he has created more than 20,000 paintings, drawings, sculptures, ceramics and other items such as costumes and theatre sets.
